

Staying Alert: Blastomycosis



As it gets colder, please continue to keep an eye out for <u>blastomycosis symptoms</u>, especially if you live, travel, work, or visit areas the fungus is found. More information and resources about blastomycosis can be found in the <u>June 2025 newsletter</u> (page 2).

<u>Blastomycosis</u> can be diagnosed at any time of the year. It can take up to three months or more for symptoms to develop after being exposed to the blastomycosis-causing fungus. People who were exposed in the spring and summer months may not show symptoms until late in the fall.

Survivor-led Committee

Heritage Canada and the National Centre for Truth and Reconciliation are accepting for applications to join a Survivor-led committee called the Indian Residential Schools National Monument Steering Committee.

Residential School Survivors and intergenerational Survivors who identify as First Nations, Inuit, or Métis are encouraged to apply and help lead the next phase of work on the national monument. This will include the design selection process, development of educational and outreach materials, and future on-site programming.

Modern Treaty and Self-Government

Crown-Indigenous Relations and Northern Affairs Canada is accepting funding proposals that support modern treaties and self-government. Funding will go to proposals which:

- Advance implementation of modern treaties and self-government arrangements.
- Promote public awareness, understanding, and build capacity among Indigenous partners.
- Encourage collaboration and co-development of policy between Indigenous governments and the federal government.

The deadline to apply is October 1, 2025 at 9:00pm (Eastern Time). To receive the necessary application forms, interested individuals can email TMAGPartenariatsMobilisation-

Climate Change and Health

The <u>Climate Change and Health Adaption Program</u> (CCHAP) is accepting funding proposals to support projects that focus on the health impacts of climate change on First Nations and Inuit communities. There are two funding streams split by geographic region, South and North.

The deadline to apply for <u>CCHAP South</u> is September 12, 2025 at 9:59pm (Eastern Time). Please e-mail <u>cchap-pccas@sac-isc.gc.ca</u> to request a copy of the application guide and proposal template.

There is no deadline to apply to <u>CCHAP North</u>, which has an ongoing intake process. Please visit the <u>CCHAP website</u> to learn more about both funding streams.



Accessibility Volunteers

The <u>Enabling Accessibility Fund</u> (EAF) is looking for youth volunteers (15 to 30 years of age) to become Youth Accessibility Leaders. Volunteers for the EAF – Youth Innovation Component will promote the program and encourage organizations to apply for its funding. Through this process, youth volunteer their time to build a more accessible Canada.

The deadline to apply is October 6, 2025 at 3:00pm (Eastern Time). Applicants will be required to collaborate with eligible organizations; this includes Indigenous organizations and municipalities.
