#### **COVID-19 Vaccine Education Checklist**

## **Purpose**

The Indigenous Services Canada (ISC) First Nations and Inuit Health Branch (FNIHB) Regional Nursing and CDC Teams are committed to supporting First Nation communities in their COVID-19 response by providing guidance in the required education, training, and resources that need to be fulfilled in order for healthcare providers to administer the COVID-19 vaccines safely and effectively.

### **Intended Audience**

Healthcare professionals administering vaccines within their scope of practice (i.e. registered nurses, licensed practical nurses, nurse practitioners, pharmacists, paramedics, physicians, students, etc.) are recommended to use this checklist to ensure that they have fulfilled at least the mandatory requirements to administer the COVID-19 vaccines under the authority of the FNIHB-Alberta Region Medical Officer of Health.

#### **Considerations**

All regulated healthcare professionals are responsible and accountable for their own practice, scope, and role and must have the knowledge, skills, and competence to administer the vaccine. The following checklist provides *mandatory and recommended* education, training, and certifications for healthcare professionals in preparation for administering the COVID-19 vaccine.
