Measles and Pregnancy

Protect your children, protect yourself, protect your community.



During pregnancy, those not immune to measles are at an increased risk of:

- Severe illness
- Pneumonia
- Hepatitis
- Encephalitis
- Hospitalization
- Loss of the baby before or during delivery

What can I do if I am pregnant and was exposed to measles?

- Reach out to your healthcare provider as soon as possible to determine if you have immunity to measles
- You may be eligible to receive immunoglobulin to help prevent infection
- Immunoglobulin is effective if given within 6 days of exposure

Potential complications to the baby include:

- Low birth weight
- Infant born with measles infection

Can I get the measles vaccine while pregnant?

- No, the measles vaccine is not recommended for pregnant individuals

Can I get a measles vaccine while nursing?

 Yes, the measles vaccine is safe to receive while breastfeeding
